About:

This role will support our team to keep the busy kitchen in tip-top condition. You'll be helping with tasks such as washing up, sorting and tidying the kitchen area as well as preparing the hospitality trolleys needed for patients and those visiting our ward areas.

Role responsibilities:

- · Ensuring the kitchen is always clean and tidy
- Washing up, operating the dishwasher, cleaning surfaces
- Sorting crockery, cutlery, and kitchen equipment
- Assisting with hospitality requirements for our patients on the wards
- · Removing kitchen waste and rubbish and taking to the refuge area
- Adhering to robust Infection Prevention control measures
- Discussing queries, problems or observations with the Cook on duty
- Operating within our Volunteering Code of Conduct at all times
- Attending relevant meetings & undertake all induction and training as required
- Acting as an ambassador for St Catherine's at all times
